

Committee in che^b By A NARA Date 3/25/77 then, can be taken as reflecting Central Committee policy. Its reaching the Liaison Office from both the local press and from reliable informants indicate that various known Communists are preparing to run in the elections.

Communist Candidates for Election

The reporting officer was informed by the Assistant Commissioner of Police that the police expect about twenty known Communists to be nominated in the coming elections. The police estimate that about five out of this total will be elected. On the question of whether the Communists will run as independents or seek the support of the major parties, available evidence is conflicting. In the past all the major parties have denounced the Communists. Additionally, in the May 10 issue of Red Flag, in the above-cited editorial, the Communists condemned the Umma Party and the Socialist Republican Party as "capitalists and supporters of imperialism" and the National Unionist Party as "bourgeois elements," and have given instructions that Communist candidates are not to cooperate with the other parties. On the other hand, press reports persist that the Communists plan to trade support with the major parties. (For example see press report cited in Khartoum 122 dated April 9, 1953.) The NUP is reported to be most favorably disposed to such an arrangement, and the Liaison Office has been informed that Mohammed JUBARA, believed by the police to be a Communist, will run as NUP candidate in Kassala.

In any event Communists will not run as candidates of the Communist Party, since the latter is, for practical purposes, outlawed in the Sudan.

Among Communists known by the police to be planning to run in the coming elections are 1) Mohammed Sayed SALAAM, President of the Sudan Workers' Federation, who will run as candidate in Khartoum North, 2) Gasim AMIN, who will be a candidate in Atbara, 3) Hassan SALAAMA, who will be a candidate in Omdurman, and 4) Mohammed JUBARA (cited above), who will be a candidate in Kassala. The police indicate that Communists have also been selected to run in El Obeid and in Kosti.

POLICE ESTIMATE OF COMMUNIST SABOTAGE

The Sudan Police believe that the Communists have not regained their previous popularity which they lost through their opposition to the Anglo-Egyptian Agreement. At the present time their strength is considered as negligible. However, the Assistant Commissioner of Police is of the opinion that the change in tactics evidenced by the present Communist support of the Agreement and the decision to participate in the elections will have the effect of restoring the Communists to their previous popular position. Ed Deeb expects that by election time in the fall, the Communists will be supported by about ten per cent of the population of the Sudan.

Data on the Seizures

1. Enclosures 1 and 2: These documents were seized by a Sudan police officer on the Khartoum-Wadi Halfa passenger train about the first week in May. These documents were part of a large bundle which contained approximately one hundred copies each of Red Flag and the policy statement. The bundle is known by the police to have come from Khartoum and is believed to have been destined for Atbara, the Railway Headquarters and one of the principal centers of Communist agitation in the Sudan. The bundle was in the possession of Mohammed EL Amin Abdalla ABBAS, Sudanese student in the Coptic College in Khartoum. The police plan to prosecute Abbas for the possession of these illegal papers and they will probably obtain a conviction. Abbas is described by the police as "a very minor figure" in the Communist organization.

2. Red Flag, issue of May 10, 1953. A few copies of this issue were seized in the Omdurman home of Abdel Wahab EL BESHIR.
